On 1st January 2010, Ḥaḍrat Khalīfatul Masīḥ V ايدهاللتخالي delivered the Friday Sermon at Baitul Futūh Mosque, London.

Hudūr ايده الله تعالى recited verse 29 of Sūrah Al-Ḥadīd, which is translated as follows:

"O ye who believe! fear Allāh and believe in His Messenger; He will give you a double share of His mercy, and will provide for you a light wherein you will walk, and will grant you forgiveness—and verily Allāh is Most Forgiving, Merciful—." (57:29)

Huḍūr الموالية said: Today is the first day of the year 2010 and it is a Friday—the most auspicious of days. May the coming year and all future years bring peace and prosperity to all Aḥmadīs. The Promised Messiah عليه says, "The true day of 'Īd and celebration for any man is when he repents and seeks forgiveness and begins making efforts to win Allāh's love." The Holy Prophet ملى الشعلية has said: "There comes a moment on every Friday, albeit a very brief one, when a believer standing in prayer is granted whatever he prays for." Thus, while the disbelievers spend this day in their revelries, a believer delights in the acceptance of his prayers. The Holy Prophet ملى الشعلية عنال said, "Friday is the most blessed of days. My followers should invoke blessings (or offer Durūd) upon me abundantly, for on this day it is presented before me."

The Promised Messiah ("Whoever abstains from sin in deference to the glory and majesty of Allāh, fearing the day when he will be held accountable before Him, such a person will be blessed with two kinds of paradise. He will be granted bliss in this world whereby a holy transformation will come over him and God will become His provider and sustainer. And,

when he dies, he will be granted eternal paradise. This will be his reward for fearing God and putting Him above all worldly desires and passions. Hence only a true believer can benefit from Friday and attain nearness to Allāh.

Huḍūr المعالية said: It is only *Taqwa* and perfect obedience to the Holy Prophet that draws Allāh's grace. Allāh rewards us twofold in the form of the good of this world and the hereafter. The Promised Messiah (عليه عليه says, "If you hold fast to *Taqwa*, you shall be granted a light that shall accompany you wherever you go." Ḥuḍūr المعالية said: As we strive for spiritual exaltation, it is also important for us to purge society of sin. We have to teach the world that the proper way of entering the new year is not by drinking and indulging in frivolities, rather one welcome the new year with prayers and sacrifices for mankind.

Explaining the meaning of the prayer, 'O Lord, grant us the good of this world and the Hereafter and save us from the torment of fire,' the Promised Messiah captures says, "The words *Rabbanā* (Our Lord) are very important because they signify that one has given up on all other 'lords' and stands before the only true Lord.... this prayer can only come from one who recognizes Allāh as his only true Lord and sees all else as of no consequence."

Ḥuḍūr Jasaid: The word  $N\bar{a}r$  in this prayer does not only point to the fire of hell but also to the countless forms of fire we face in this world, such as disasters and calamites, fear, bloodshed, famine, disease, frustration and apprehensions about family and relations. All these are kinds of fire that we call on Allāh to save us from. May Allāh grant us the good things of this world and the hereafter and save us from torments of both worlds. May this new year and every year hence bring joy to all Aḥmadīs and may no misfortune ever befall us.  $\bar{A}m\bar{i}n$ .
