On 7th May, 2010, Ḥaḍrat Khalīfatul Masīḥ V ايده الله الله الله delivered the Friday Sermon at Baitul Futūh Mosque, London.

Ḥuḍūr أيه الله began the sermon by reciting verse 4 of Sūrah Fāṭir, which is translated as follows:

'O ye men, remember the favour of Allāh towards you. Is there any Creator other than Allāh *Who* provides for you from the heaven and earth? There is none worthy of worship but He. Whither then are you turned away?' (35:4)

Ḥuḍūr إلى said: Al-Khāliq is an attributive name of Allāh which has been mentioned numerous times in the Holy Qur'ān. According to the lexicons, the root word Khalq has the following meanings: To take a proper measure before creating something; to create something from nothing without copying any prior design; and to make something from another, or to invent something. To create from nothing is a quality that exclusively belongs to Allāh. Thus, Al-Khāliq and Al-Khallāq are Divine attributes, and the article Al makes them applicable only to Allāh, for He alone creates from nothing. With reference to creation, the Holy Qur'ān also mentions some of other Divine attributes, such as Al-Bārī, Al-Badī' and Al-Fāṭir.

Huḍūr المواشقال said: The verse I have recited means that the earth cannot produce anything (viz. means of subsistence) on its own without help from heaven. Even earthly water dries up without heavenly rain. In the same way as Allāh provides us with physical bounties, He also grants us spiritual bounties. Thus, a pure nature is obliged to worship the One True God.

Huḍūr اليوالشرة said: Among Allāh's spiritual bounties is the presence of His Prophets and chosen ones, and the greatest of them is our Holy Prophet مسلى ألله بالله با

Huḍūr الموالية said: Spiritual water descends from heaven through God's chosen servants. While heavenly rain causes crops and orchards to grow, it also produces weeds that are harmful for the crops. Likewise, when spiritual water descends from heaven through God's chosen servants, it benefits those who are pure hearted and diligent, but deprives those who oppose them and turn their back to the faith and thus end up ruining their hereafter.

Ḥuḍūr المعافل said: Those who partook of the spiritual water that was granted to the Promised Messiah عليه were also shown signs of Divine love and succour. They witnessed the growth of their spirituality in their own lives while the opponents remained deprived. The weeds of opposition also grew, but they could not harm the orchards and fields of the true faith. This is why we have been urged to value the bounty and guidance that has been given to us and use it to nourish *Taqwa* and righteousness.

Ḥuḍūr الموالستان said: Allāh hears the supplications of man when he is in distress. Speaking about the persecution faced by the Jamā'at in Pakistan and other countries, Ḥuḍūr الموالستان said: In order to live successfully through these trials and tribulations we have to realize that God is our only refuge and to Him we must submit. Pray with the utmost anguish and humility and you will see how God responds to your payers and removes all our difficulties.

Ḥuḍūr إليوالله said: Most of all we need to attend to our obligatory prayers and make a point of offering them regularly. There should not be even a single one among us who misses his prayers. It is essential to worship Allāh in order to absorb His blessings. This is the main purpose of man's creation. We can only fulfil our duty towards our Master and Creator by submitting to Him as the only One Who is worthy of worship. May Allāh enable us to do so. $\bar{A}m\bar{n}n$.
