Editor's Note:

The notation (sa) is an abbreviation of the prayer *sallallāhu ‘alaihi wa sallam* (peace and blessings of God be upon him), which we say for the Holy Prophet Muhammad (sa). Though the prayer has not been written in full, nevertheless it should be understood as being repeated in full in each case.

Similarly, the notation (as) is an abbreviation of the prayer *‘alaihis-salam* (peace be upon him) and is used at the mention of the Promised Messiah (as) and all other prophets of God.

The notation (ra) is an abbreviation of the prayer *radiyallahu ‘anhu/‘anha /‘anhum* (may Allah be pleased with him/her/them) and is used for the companions of the Holy Prophet (sa) and the Promised Messiah (as).

The notation (aba) is an abbreviation of the prayer *ayyadahullahu ta’ala bi-nasrihil-‘aziz* (may Allah be his helper) and is used at the mention of the current Khalifa (aba).

In recent years we have seen the rapid and extraordinary development of technology and in particular the use of Internet and social media. The Internet was officially established on January 1, 1983, and by 2000 half of all US homes had a personal computer. Social media originally emerged in the late 1980s and 1990s; however, the term ‘social media’ became widely used in 2004.

The children writing in this issue were born into this age of technology and are learning how to navigate the dangers inherent in this rapidly advancing phenomenon. The presence of technology, computers, the Internet and social media is all a part of their world and identity.

Benefits of Social Media

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad, Khalifat-ul-Masih V (aba) explained, “These days, many things lead to the displeasure of God. Correct use of these things is not bad; however, their incorrect use leads to spreading foulness, evil and sin. However, the same thing can also be a means of spreading goodness.

Television can be a source of knowledge and education, but it can also spread indecency. In these current times, Ahmadiyya Jama‘at and Ahmadis are making the best use of the television. I had drawn attention to watching MTA during the days of the Jalsa, and this influenced some people. They have said to me that they did not watch MTA before, but now because of your drawing of our attention to it, we have started watching it. They are now expressing regret to me for not watching MTA before and being connected to it and some say that even viewing it for just a week to ten days has improved their standard of spirituality and knowledge. They have learned about Jama‘at.

Hence, I am reminding again that you should pay great attention in your homes to gain benefit from this blessing which Allah the Exalted has bestowed on us for our training and to increase our knowledge and spirituality, so our generations may stay firm on Ahmadiyyat. Hence, we should try to connect



ourselves to MTA. In addition to sermons, there are many live programs which can enhance religious knowledge and spirituality. The Jama‘at spends hundreds of thousands of dollars every year [on MTA] for the training of the Jama‘at members.

If members of the Jama‘at do not avail of it, it will be their own loss. Outsiders are gaining benefit from MTA and are realizing the truthfulness of the Jama‘at and are knowing about and understanding the unity of Allah and the reality of Islam. Hence, Ahmadis in Australia and the rest of the world should gain maximum benefit from MTA. One of its blessings is that it is a great means to connect the Jama‘at to the blessings of Khilafat. Hence, we must avail of it.” (*Friday Sermon, October 18, 2013, Bait-ul-Huda Mosque, Sydney, Australia.*)

“Today, Allah the Exalted has provided efficient means to spread the books [of the Promised Messiah (as)] and respond to the opponents of Islam. It used to take time to spread books, but now, a message can be delivered instantaneously. As soon as a book is published, it can be printed at the other end. These days, the books of the Promised Messiah (as), the Holy Quran, and other Islamic literature is traversing new stages of broadcast through Internet and television. The speed of media today could not have been imagined a few decades ago.

Thus, avail these opportunities given to us by Allah the Exalted, for preaching and defense of Islam. It is a favor of Allah the Exalted that he has provided these latest inventions in this time. - The Ten Conditions of Bai'at App tells you lots of different information about what the Ten conditions of Bai'at are.
- The askislam app allows you to ask any questions about Islam and get answers. For example, I asked about animals and it gave me an audio recording of

Hazrat Mirza Tahir Ahmad, Khalifat-ul-Mash IV (rh) explaining about animal testing in Islam and why it is allowed.



Another form of technology which is very important to us is MTA. Huzoor (aba) said, "I have repeatedly drawn the attention of Ahmadis all around the world to watch programs on MTA. Parents should pay attention to this,

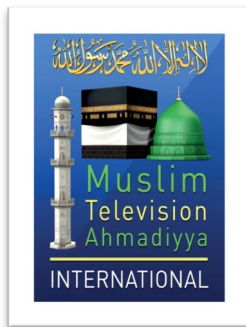

2. **Wakalat-e-Tasneef** This agency translates, formats, and publishes Jama'at books. They've translated the Holy Qur'an into 77 languages and made various works available for younger readers using digital software.

3. Al-Islam and Digital Resources

Our official website, alislam.org, offers a wealth of resources, including MTA programs, Jama'at articles, and digital archives. Innovative tools like the ReadQuran app and Qur'an search programs allow users to explore the Qur'an anytime, anywhere.

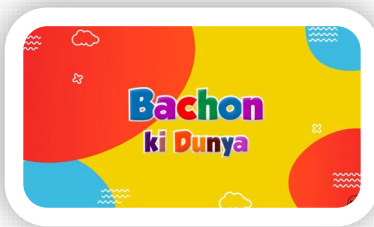
In addition to these benefits, we must be aware of technology's dangers. We should set time limits for screen use to protect our eyes and avoid wasting time on social media.

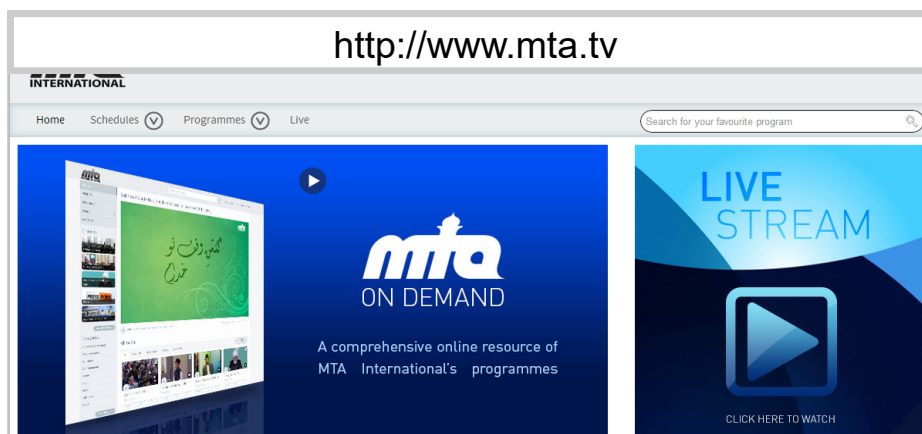

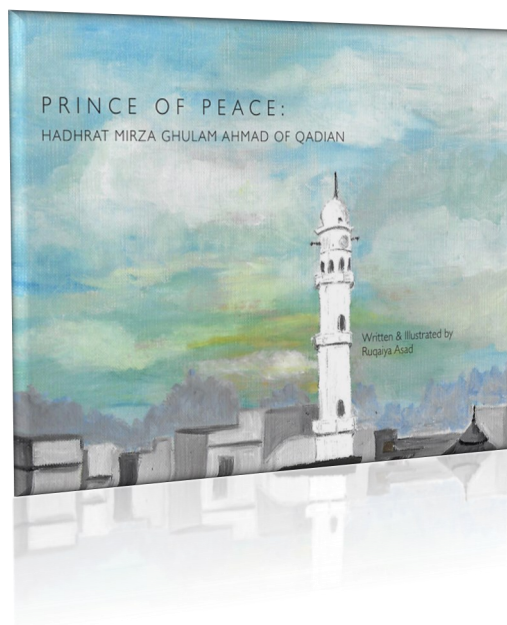

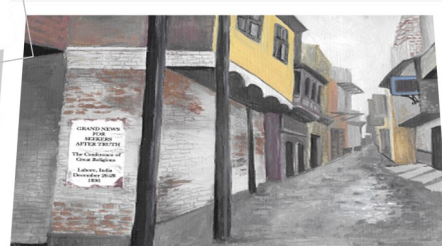
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A TRUE BLESSING

Also, although social media itself is not inherently harmful, some sites, games, and other sources contain inappropriate content, which must be avoided.



Huzoor (aba) has repeatedly reminded us of the importance of using social media wisely. He says:

“Thus, in the current era, media has brought us closer to each other, not just within a country but around the world. Unfortunately, rather than bringing us closer to virtues, it has brought us closer to following Satan. Under such circumstances, an Ahmadi should be extremely watchful of his own state. Allah the Exalted has bestowed MTA on us. Allah the Exalted has given us a website for spiritual and educational programs of Jama‘at. We can only stay focused on it if we pay full attention to it. This will bring us closer to God and we will be saved from Satan.” (Friday Sermon May 20, 2016, Gottenberg, Sweden)

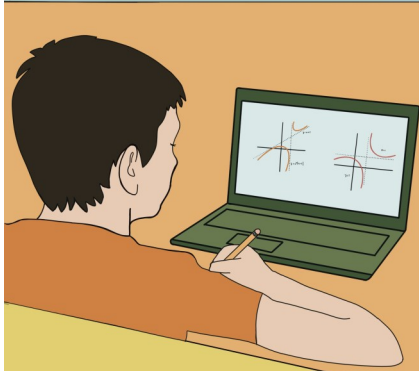

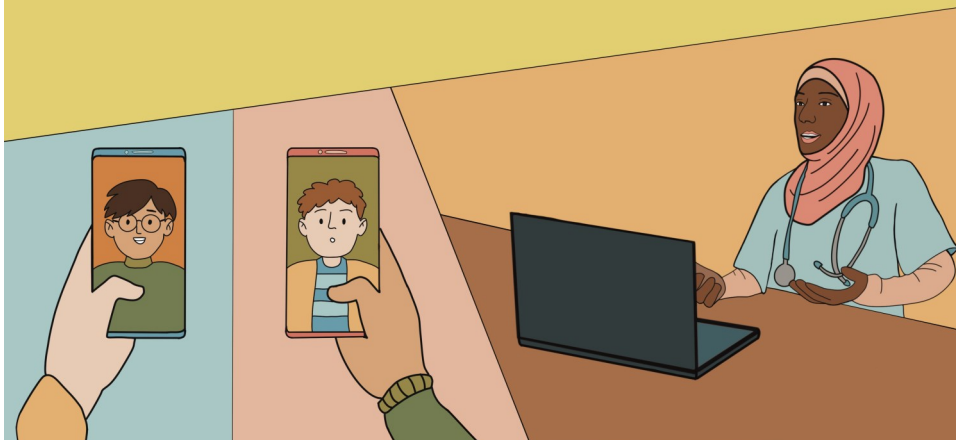
Technology... A Gift from Allah

Day and Night Watch: Whether it's daytime or nighttime, these cameras are always awake. They ensure the house is safe even when everyone is asleep.

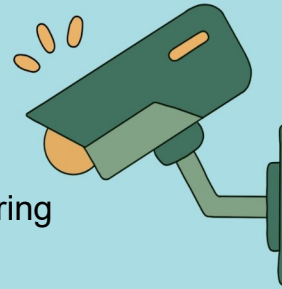

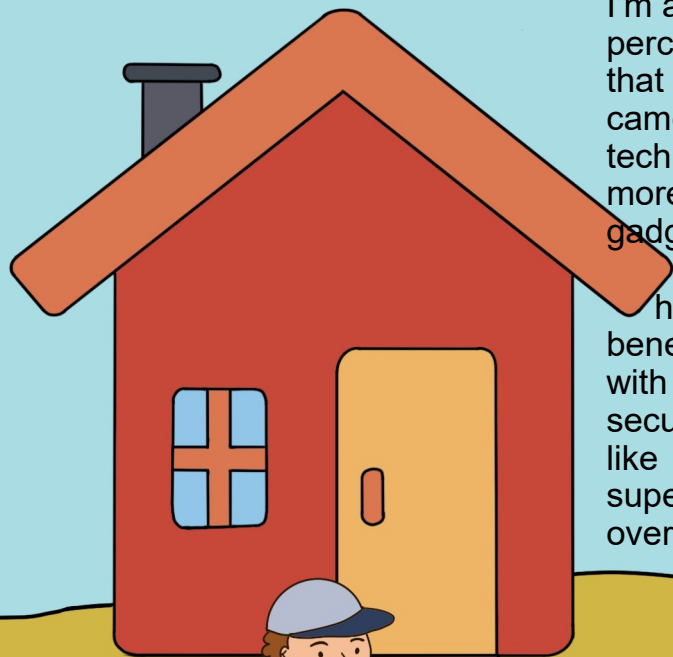


Guardians of the Yard: Imagine having a superhero that watches over the front yard. It can help spot any strangers or even track down that runaway soccer ball.

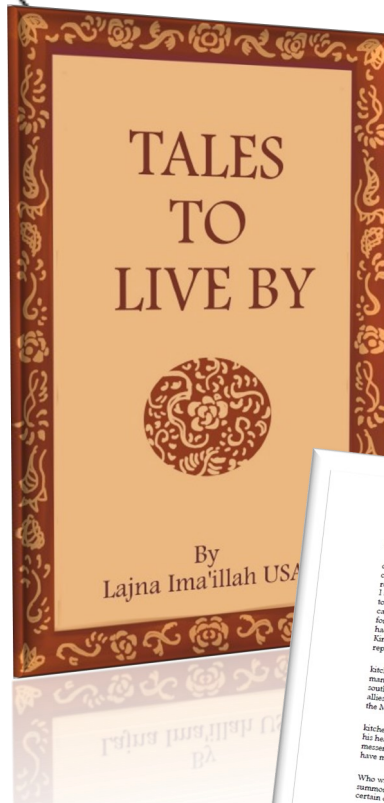

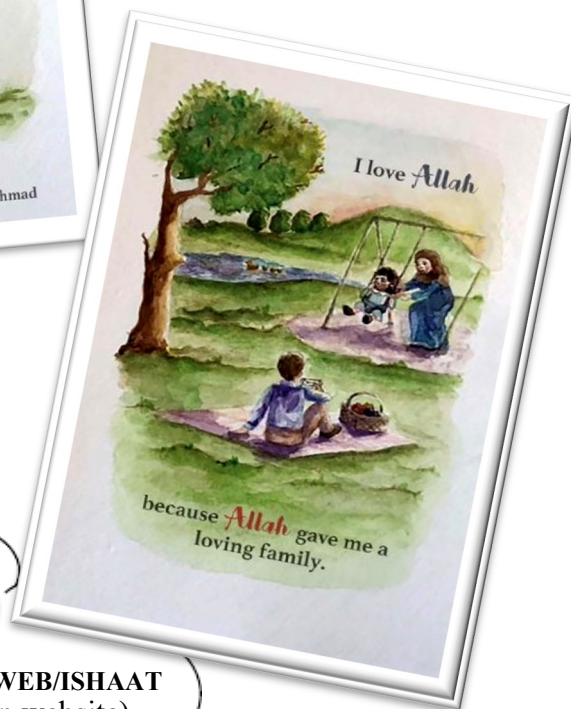

“Take advantage of five before five: your youth before your old age, your health before your illness, your riches before your poverty, your free time before your work, and your life before your death” (*Shu‘ab al-Iman lil-Bayhaqi 10250, Sahih*)



This hadith underscores the importance of time in Islam. Our youth and blessings should not be wasted on vain things, but rather used to achieve goals and do good.

In the Holy Qur'an, Allah says:

“And every one has a goal which dominates him; vie, then, with one another in good works. Wherever you be, Allah will bring you all together. Surely, Allah has the power to do all that He wills” [Ch. 2: V. 149].

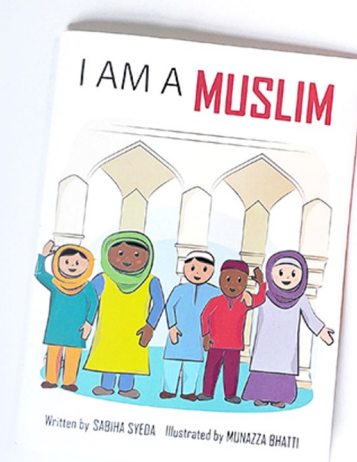

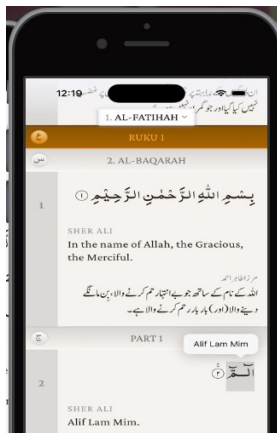


to make sure they involve being safe and are not dangerous and you are not interacting with strangers.

So in this manner the systems that are in place today i.e. artificial Intelligence, it possesses good and good deeds can be done through it, and we can use it well for translation. But to completely rely or depend on it is incorrect, we have to examine it later. For example, if we translate our religious books using A.I., then we have to revise it once more, we have to edit it again. A.I. only has the capacity proportional to how much information you've fed it. It will produce whatever the person feeds it.

Watching Huzoor (aba) is a significant blessing of technology, making it clear that this gift from Allah can be used to strengthen our faith.

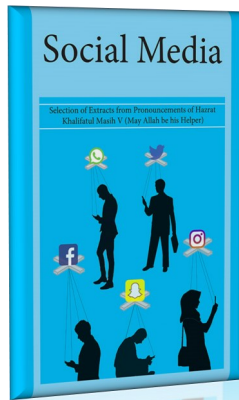
COMMUNICATION

An Important Tool

Advancements are occurring at a rapid pace, with new developments that are difficult to keep up with. An important fact to keep in mind is that we must use this new technology wisely; it should serve as a way to improve the lives of individuals and society at large.

“From the evil of the sneaking whisperer.” [Ch. 114, V. 5]

When excessive use begins leading to the neglect of worship of a believer, only then does Satan succeed in his mission, which is why we must make a constant effort to deflect these attacks even when they are not visibly apparent.

According to a 2023 survey by the website Reviews.org, the number of times that Americans check their phones per day is around 144 times. Huzoor (aba) has said:

“If worldly desire increases so that one is engrossed in TV dramas and the Internet and is late in offering Salat, then love for Allah cannot develop. Gaining this love requires sacrifice of desires.” (Waqf-e-Nau Class, October 8, 2011, Germany)

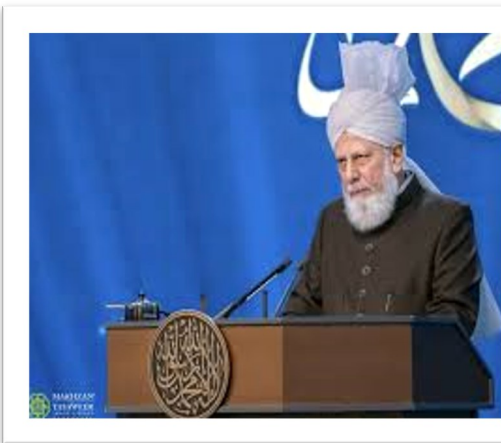

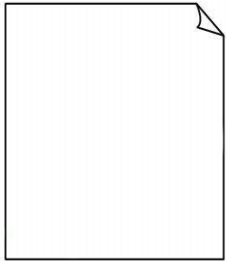


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
