## Noon Saakin and Tanween

*What is Noon Saakin?*

- The letter ن with a sukoon is called Noon Saakin
- Noon Saakin may come either in between letters of a word or at the end of a word.

أَنْعَمْتَ - أَنْزِلَ - مِنْهُمْ - كُنْتُمْ -

مَنْ مِنْ إِنْ كُنْ

## Noon Saakin and Tanween

*What is Tanween?*

- Double strokes over or below a letter are called Tanween

سَوَاءٌ - رَغَدًا - عَيْنٍ

- Tanween can never come in between a word. It will always appear at the end of a word.
- Noon Saakin and Tanween have different shapes however their pronunciation is the same. They both produce nasal sound.

## **Special Rules concerning Noon Saakin and Tanween**

*Two kinds of nasal sound*

- 1) Clear and short nasal sound of about one second
- 2) Sustained, concealed and prolonged nasal sound of about two seconds

*However*

*There are specific places where  
Noon Saakin and Tanween  
do not produce nasal sound at all*

## No Nasal Sound

*Remember the Rule*

When a Noon Saakin or Tanween is followed by

Raa Mushaddad (رّ)

مِنْ رَبِّهِمْ ، مُحَمَّدٌ رَّسُولُ اللَّهِ

OR

Laam Mushaddad (لّ)

هَبْ لَنَا مِنْ لَدُنْكَ رَحْمَةً ، أَشْهَدُ أَنْ لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ

A nasal sound will not be made while joining

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## More Practice Examples

هُدًى لِلْمُتَّقِينَ

وَلَمْ يَكُنْ لَهُ كُفُوًا أَحَدٌ

وَيَلُّ لِكُلِّ هُمَزَةٍ لُّمَزَةٌ

فَهُوَ فِي عِيشَةٍ رَاضِيَةٍ

إِنَّ رَبَّهُم بِهِمْ يَوْمَئِذٍ لَّخَبِيرٌ

يَوْمَئِذٍ يَصُدُّرُ النَّاسُ أَشْتَاتًا لَّيُرُوا أَعْمَالَهُمْ
